

New YECC Flag Plaza

We are closing in on enough funds to finish the next step on the new flagpole and veteran's plaza. Our goal is to have the area weed free, the lawn cut out, and pavers and gravel laid for our Memorial Day Celebration. Donations are still needed as we push forward on the final stage of the project: a very special sign that would curve around the back edge of the pavers and demonstrate our pride in our veterans. Flag Etiquette - Half Staff, Half Mast

Scheduled days when the American flag is at half-mast:

- Peace Officers Memorial Day 15 May (sunrise to sunset)
- Memorial Day the last Monday in May (sunrise until **noon**)
- Patriot Day 11 September (sunrise until sunset)
- Korean War Veterans Armistice Day 27 July (sunrise to sunset)
- National Firefighters Memorial Day 5 May (sunrise to sunset)
- Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day 7 December (sunrise to sunset)

If your flag is at the peak of the pole, lower it all the way, then rapidly raise it to full-staff, then lower it slowly to the middle of the pole. If you are starting out to raise the flag from the bottom, raise it rapidly to full-staff and then lower it slowly to the middle of the pole.

At sunset, raise the flag back up to the peak. Memorial Day honors the war dead in the morning, but then at noon, it is raised by the living to show that the nation lives, for the flag is a symbol of a living nation.

Flags flown on land are "half-staff." Flags flown on ships are "half-mast."

Summer Wall Project

Beginning on May 1st, the resurfacing and painting of the large wall around the pool area will begin. The professional estimates for this job were *way* out of our budget, but the board decided we couldn't wait another summer to begin vital restoration, so we ask members who are able to work for about an hour starting at 6:00 each morning. We will erect a shade tent to help everyone stay cool. The first step is to scrape the damaged material, then we'll clean up the mess and patch the wall with QuickCrete. We have used this material on other restorations, and it does really well. After the repair dries, we will paint.


